TRAIL: Rated 1A, Walk is on sidewalks and Riverwalk boardwalk. Visit 1898 Memorial (only successful coup d'etat in US history), pass Cape Fear Museum, Children's Museum, RR Museum and Serpentarium (8K mark, feeding at 3 PM Sat/Sun). Tours of Coast Guard Cutter Diligence if in port. View Battleship North Carolina, Cotton Exchange, and historical photos in new Convention Center. Frequent TV and movie productions along the route.

HOW TO GET THERE: From West- I-40 East to exit 416A for I-140W/US17S "Shalotte & Myrtle Beach" * 7 miles to US421/US17S. 2.8 miles to left at 1st light US74E "Wilmington." ** Left lane as you cross Isabel Holmes bridge, exit "Wilmington Downtown" onto 3rd St. Right at third light on Redcross St. Three blocks to "T" at Nutt St. Right, then immediate left to Visitor Center next to Railroad Museum. Look for Locomotive.

From North: US17S becomes I-140 in Wilmington. Then as * above.
From South or West via US17N, US74E, US76E: As approach Wilmington exit for US421N/US17N/US74E. Pass Battleship Memorial, over Thomas Rhodes Bridge, then right at light on US74E. Then as ** above.
